COMPETITIONS

BOLO BUILDING:

Build Bolo out of whatever materials you would like to use.
The building should be large enough to be fully functional as bolo.
The pit should be large enough for your Troop.
The "seat" should be functional and safe.

The Bolos will be judged on imagination, functionality, and sanitary.

LOST SCOUT: Troop 616

The Troop or Patrol will be searching for a "Lost Scout".
They will be listening for the distress signals, find the lost Scout, treat for any first aid emergencies, build a stretcher and prepare to transport the Scout out.

The materials for this event will be furnished.

COOKING COMPETITION:

The Cooking Competition will be "Something on a Stick".

The Scouts must pick some type of food and place it on a stick or spit and cook it over an open fire. (wood or charcoal)

The foods will be judged on appearance, imagination, and taste.
Any type of food; meat, vegetable, bread, or dessert will be accepted so experiment, and use your imaginations.

COMPASS COURSE: Troop 315

This will be a timed event where Scouts use a compass to go point to point picking up letters to solve a word puzzle.
