## **EVENTS**

### **FIRST AID HURRY CASES**

Scouts walk the trail and come up on various first aid emergencies. Events will be as life-like as possible. The Scouts will be judged by how well they react to the emergency and how well they perform the needed first aid.

<i>Case A.</i>	<i>Severe bleeding</i>	<i>Example: Scout is splitting a log. The axe bounces off and strikes his leg</i>
<i>Case B.</i>	<i>Heart Attack</i>	<i>Example: Scout finds leader on trail unconscious.</i>
<i>Case C.</i>	<i>Poisoning</i>	<i>Example: Scout's little brother puts something in his water bottle</i>
<i>Case D.</i>	<i>Stopped breathing</i>	<i>Example: Scout pulls victim out of lake.</i>

### **CANOE EVENTS**

#### **Canoe Tug of War**

Two canoes will be tied together stern to stern. Two paddlers will be in each boat. They will paddle in opposite directions trying to pull the other past the buoy.

#### **Canoe race**

This will be a timed race around a figure 8 course. Two or three Scouts will navigate canoe around the course as a timed event.

### **BUSTED OVEN**

This will be a dish prepared with a special ingredient. The ingredient this time will be: BACON
