

Unaka Challenge Camporee

The Unaka District Camporee will be held October 7 – October 9, 2011 at Hiwassee College near Madisonville, TN. The college is located on Hiwassee Road about 2 ½ miles from downtown Madisonville. Continue past the two traffic lights next to the courthouse without making any turns, eventually crossing the railroad tracks. A few blocks later you will see a large Hiwassee College sign. Bear right, following this road for 2 miles to the Hiwassee campus. As you near the campus you will cross Bat Creek. You will see a brick Hiwassee College sign on an elevation to the left. Continue on another 300 feet and then bear left into the campus, passing between a large brick entrance that is on both sides of the road.

- Fire pits will be allowed with all sod to be replaced before departure. It is highly recommended that each troop bring their own wood.
- There will be Port-a-potties for our use
- Drinking water will also be available
- Use of the college swimming pool will be made available (weather permitting)

Cost for the camporee will be \$8.00 for youth and \$ 5.00 for adults to be collected at the Cracker Barrel on Friday night.

Competitions

1. FIRE BUILDING (Troop 118)

Entire Patrol participates. Judge will give the patrol leader 2 matches or flint & steel. A provided container filled one half full of water containing one heaping tablespoon of detergent. Object is to boil the water until soap suds boil over the top of the can using only native materials to build fire. Time will be called the second the suds boil over the top of the can.

SCORING: Event will be timed.

2. TUG OF WAR (Troop 616)

Equipment: A 3/4 inch rope, 30 or 40 feet in length.

Action: Place a marker around the center of the rope. Draw a divider line on the ground and directly under the tape mark on the rope. On each side of the divider line and 6 feet from it, mark another line on the ground. Each 4 scout team must be made up of one Patrol Leader, one new scout, one scout less than 100 lbs, one older scout. The patrol that pulls the marker over the line two out of three pulls is the winner of a match.

SCORING: Matches will be "pulled" until winners are determined.

3. FLAG POLE RAISING (Troop 315)

Full Patrol participates, the judge furnishing 2 wooden staves, of a 10 foot length, 1 pole with Patrol Flag attached, 4 pieces of lashing cord, 3 guy lines about 30 feet long, 3 wooden stakes, a hand ax for driving stakes. Patrols line up with equipment in front of them...upon starting signal, they lash two staves together with Patrol Flag on top staff to form a pole approximately 20 feet long. Then attach guy lines to the pole approximately three quarters (15'+/-) from ground. Then the flag pole is raised and secured to the stakes in the ground. The pole must remain standing for at least one (1) minute.

SCORING: The fastest time wins. Thirty seconds will be added to the time for each knot or lash which fails to hold or is improperly tied/lashed.

4. TOMAHAWK THROW (Troop 10)

Each Scout will be taught how to throw a tomahawk and given a chance to practice throwing it. After the Scout has had a chance to practice, he will throw three "hawks" for his score. The target is a cross sectional area of a log set upon a tripod to help to support the log. Each Scout will be awarded points for how close to the center of the target he gets and how many hawks he sticks.

SCORING: The patrol champion will be the Scout who scores the highest. The patrol score will be the total sum of the score of each Scout, divided by the number of Scouts in the patrol.

5. FIRST AID RELAY (this will be a backup activity in case one of the other activities is not available so, "Be Prepared")

Set-up and Rules: One Scout is the victim. The patrol is handed a card with three injuries listed; wound on side of head, broken arm between elbow and wrist, and sprained ankle. Scouts must correctly tie a bandage for head wound, splint and sling arm, and bandage ankle. Note-different types of injuries may be presented in lieu of the three identified, thus forcing the Scouts to think about proper first aid and not just one type of procedural care.

SCORING: Based on accuracy of care – not a timed event.

6. BUSTED OVEN – PIT COOKING

Food wrapped in foil or placed in a Dutch Oven cooked in a pit. Cook whatever you desire - whole chickens, hams, turkeys, roasts, baked beans etc. Dig a hole two to three times larger than the Dutch Oven or the total size of the foil packages that will go into the pit. Build a fire in the pit or use charcoal and put your Dutch Oven or foil packages inside. Cover coals in the pit with 4 to 6 inches of dirt. Allow meat about the size of a chicken to cook from 3 to 3 1/2 hours. Subtract or add time to this amount for smaller or larger items. **(Remember "Leave No Trace" before you leave)**
