EVENTS

Patrols will be observed operating as a patrol, working together, carrying patrol flag

1) PATROL PROJECT

Each patrol will conduct a service project prior to the camporee. The project will be presented by the patrol leader to Troop 118 SPL on the PATROL PROJECT FORM during the cracker-barrel Fri evening. All details will be on the form and there will be no discussion about the project with the committee. Only entries on the form will be accepted.

The committee will consist of the SPL, or his delegate, of each troop attending. Each patrol will receive the same number of points for participating. One patrol will be chosen by the committee to present their project at the campfire. That patrol will receive a ribbon.

- 2) **PATROL SLED RACE---** Each patrol will build a sled from tree limbs or lumber using only lashings, no nails or screws. You may drill holes as needed to pass rope through. Each sled must have at least one of each of these lashings: square, diagonal, round, shear.
 - Each sled will be lashed at the event and can be lashed at any time during the day. **2PM** A timed elimination race will be held on a course laid out in advance. Each sled will have one scout passenger and be pulled by four scouts. If your patrol has less than 5 members you can recruit help from other patrols, BUT, the volunteer can not have already participated or will participate with his patrol later. Judging will be on lashing accuracy and race speed.
- 3) **TWRA virtual shooting trailer.** Virtual shooting sports of all kinds. Open all day Sat, first come, first served.
- 4) **Knot Tying game.** Covers the 7 basic knots tied in a special way. Instructions will be given at game time.

NEED MORE ACTIVITIES

5) **BUSTED OVEN**

Camp made yeast bread made in a cardboard oven. Each patrol entering will be given a number at the cracker-barrel. The number will be given to the troop's SPL. A list of numbers and patrol name will be kept for judging.

The oven must be scout made and can be made before the Freezoree.

The bread can be any type of bread such as loaf, rolls, dessert bread etc. and must be made in camp.

To enter:

The entry number, bread, recipe, & box oven will be taken to the potluck supper and displayed together. Each entry will be numbered and the judges will eat first so they are sure to have some of each entry. The judges will announce the winning entry at the campfire.

Each troop will choose a scout delegate to be a judge.

If you aren't familiar with making yeast bread be sure to follow the recipe closely. It would pay to make the recipe as a test before the campout. Read up about making bread to be familiar with the process. Most yeast bread requires rising two times. Here is a general time line you might want to follow. If it doesn't fit your recipe, follow the recipe. The time is in minutes and you should back up that many minutes from the time the bread needs to be done. You can adjust this to fit your recipe.

210-180 mix and knead

180-120, first rise.

start charcoal

120-30, shape bread and second rise.

30-0 bake

6) 6PM pot luck supper. Use your imagination so we all don't bring stew. Each patrol should bring enough to feed the patrol. Bring your dishes to Troop118 campsite. Bring a table to serve from. Bread judges will eat first to sample busted oven entries.

CAMPFIRE-Seibert

I would like the campfire to be organized and hosted by a patrol. They would be responsible for firewood, order of events, and presenting awards. Patrols will submit songs/ skits to me for approval before the camporee.

CHURCH
