## Unaka District Spring Camporee May 4 - 6, 2007

The Spring Camporee will be held on the Alan Healey property on McMinn County Road #712. To reach the Camporee site go south on highway 11 to Riceville. Turn left just past the BP station on to McMinn County road #79. Cross the railroad tracks, turn left and then turn right on to County Road #713 travel 0.9 mile. Turn left on to county road #712 and follow it for 0.9. Turn left onto the Healey property. Signs will be in place for directions.

After your troop arrives at the open field you will be directed to your camping location. Fire pits will be allowed with all sod to be replaced before departure. Some dead / fallen wood will be available, but it is recommended each troop bring their own wood. There will be 2 port-a-potties for our use.

**Drinking water is available but bring your own water for starts.**
