EVENTS

Sled Race:

- Each patrol is to build a sled out of all natural wood. No man made lumber.
- Each team will pull a 30 gallon tote full of water through a course. The team with the fastest time and the most water left in the tote will win.
- The quality of the lashings and the originality of the sled will count as well.

Fire building:

- Scouts will build a fire and attempt to burn a piece of string in half.
- All materials will be provided and all scouts will be given the same type of and amount of materials.
- Timed event.
- Fires will be started with a flint and steel.

Cross cut saw:

- Each patrol will compete.
- The event will be judged by dividing the time (number of seconds) by the diameter (inches).

Unusual meat on a stick:

- No common cuts or types of meat.
- Scouts can use beef, chicken or pork **only** if it is not a commonly used cut of meat.
- We encourage the scouts to find uncommon types of meat (deer, rabbit, squirrel, etc.).
- The more unusual the better.
- Must be cooked and served on a stick not a metal skewer.
