2013 Fall Camp-o-ree Events

The fall camp-o-ree will be focused on orienteering events. Scouts should be familiar with the second and first class requirements from their scout handbook.

1. a. Demonstrate how a compass works and how to orient a map. Explain what map symbols mean.
b. Using a compass and a map together, take a five-mile hike (or 10 miles by bike) approved by your adult leader and your parent or guardian.
2. Demonstrate how to find directions during the day and at night without using a compass.
3. Using a map and compass, complete an orienteering course that covers at least one mile and requires measuring the height and/or width of designated items (tree, tower, canyon, ditch, etc.)

One Mile Compass Course

Patrols will navigate a one mile orienteering course. At each stopping point, a competition will take place involving map and compass skills. Each patrol will do a competition then be given bearings to the next event. Each patrol will time itself during the course and stopping their time during the skill events.

Map the Course

Patrol will use bearings and distances travelled to draw a scale map of their course. The event will be judged on the accuracy of the map.

Five Mile Map Course

Patrols will follow a map course around the farm going from point to point, finding the jugs and recording the messages on them. This is not a timed course but, a practice using a map and compass to cover a cross country course.

Cooking on a Rock

Patrols will prepare a food item on a rock heated by a fire or charcoal. The dish could be a meat, vegetable, bread, or a desert. The patrol needs to select and bring their own rocks. Use your imagination.
