

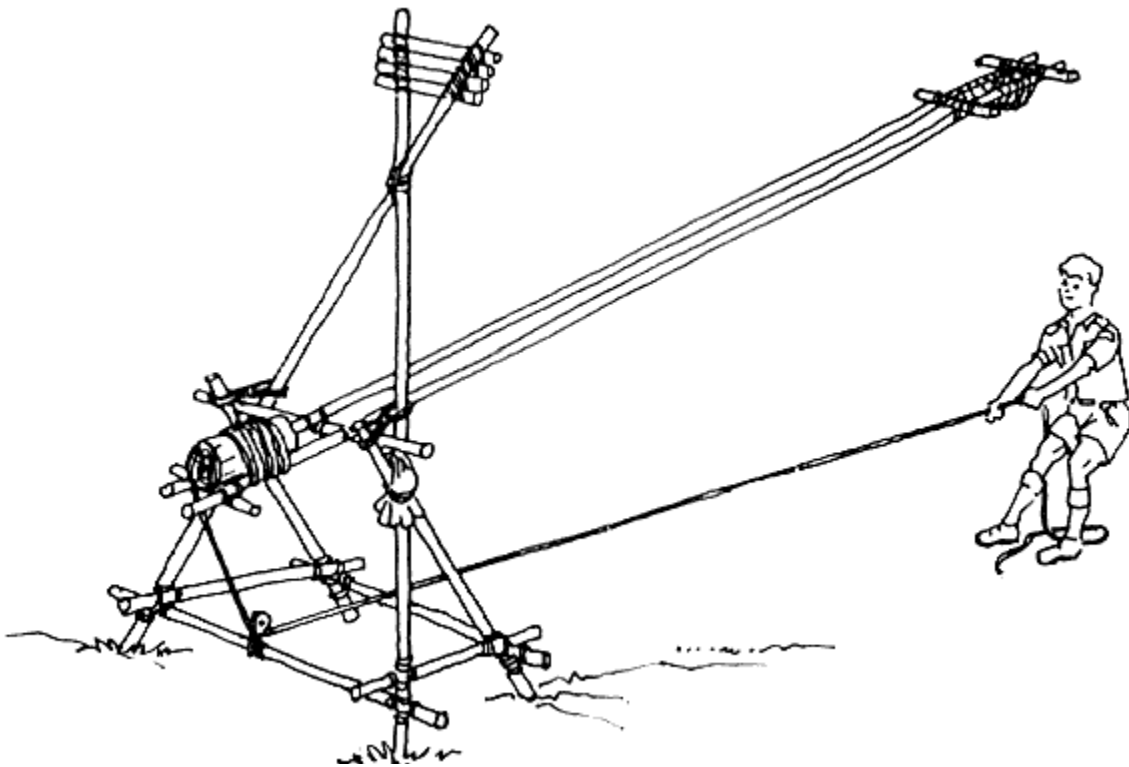

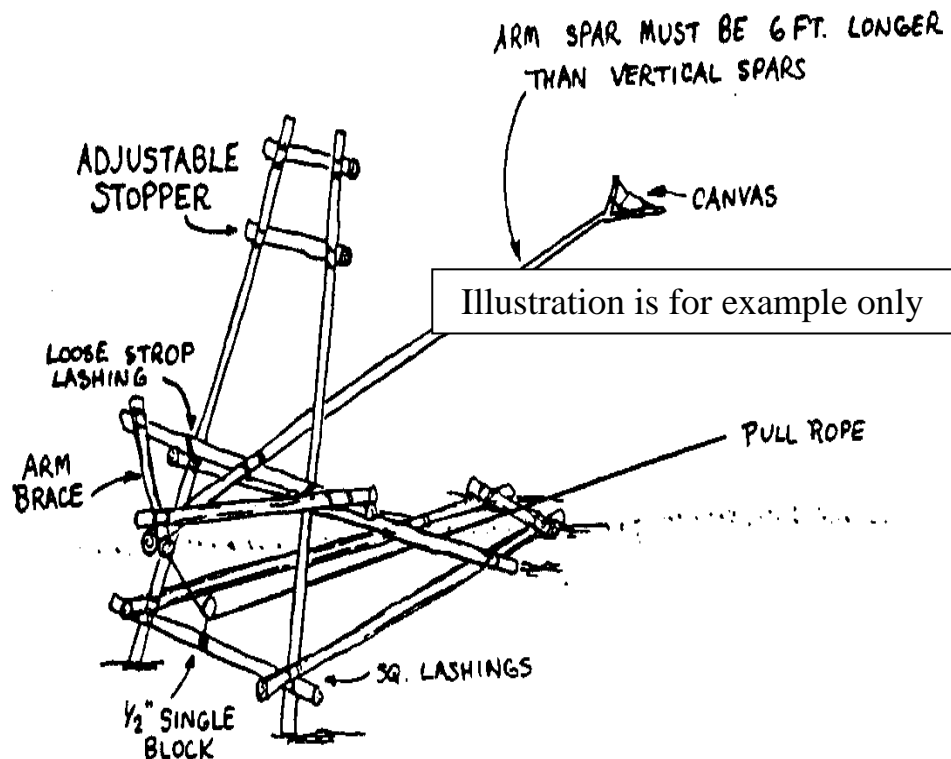

COMPETITIONS

1. Catapult Building

- Troops and Patrols will be building, testing, and firing their Pioneering skills catapults. Catapults must be Scout fired with no weights or springs being used. Simple hardware such as pulleys and I-bolts may be used. Scouts will launch $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon milk jugs filled with water. The object is to see what Troop or Patrol can build a catapult and launch theirs the furthest. Each Troop or Patrol will be allowed 3 shots during the competition.
- Each Troop is responsible for gathering their-own materials including $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon containers. Scouts can work on the catapult projects at Troop meetings before the Camporee, but final building of the catapults will take place Saturday at the firing line. This catapult can also serve as a project for Requirement #10 of the Pioneering Merit Badge. There will be awards for the most impressive designs.



2. Log Pull Relay

Scout Patrol with a 10 foot rope; judged on time. Teams are arranged three Scouts at each end of the course. Fewer scouts can be used but, may have to pull multiple times. The first Scout ties the rope to a log and pulls the log to the other end of the course to be pulled back by the second Scout, and so on. The timber hitch must be used for this competition.

3. Knot Tying

The following 7 knots will be tied under actual, usable conditions:

bowline	square knot	two half hitches
taut-line hitch	sheet bend	
timber hitch	clove hitch	

Entire patrol participates lined up in relay style. On judge's signal, first Scout runs back (judge will announce next knot before next Scout is tagged), and tags next Scout who follows same procedure, then to next Scout, etc., until all 7 knots are tied. If a Scout ties a knot improperly or does not know the knot, the judge will declare one miss and direct the next Scout to run forward. Five minute time limit.

SCORING: A timed event. There will be a 15 sec. penalty for each incorrect knot.

4. Cracked Skillet Breakfast Competition

Any type of breakfast entrée for our judges to taste and enjoy. You can enter pancakes, breakfast burritos, Dutch oven casseroles, whatever your specialty. Just put your Troop and Patrol name on it and turn it in to the judges between 8:30 and 9:00 on Saturday morning.
